#### FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR

How might we prepare well for Easter Sunday?

We've been doing so throughout Lent by focusing on the words Jesus spoke from the cross. Our Lenten worship services have prompted us to reflect on the nature of Jesus' honesty, compassion, trust in God,



forgiveness, constancy, and chosen way of living as the Son of God. You and I have been invited to follow Jesus' lead, either for the first time or as an act of personal renewal. I hope each of us has decided to do so.

Now try reading the Gospel accounts of Holy Week. Read them slowly. Make notes whenever a thought crosses your mind or a feeling touches your heart. Pay close attention to how civic and religious leaders, the general population, and even the disciples consistently misunderstand Jesus or try to use him for their own ends. As you move from story to story, ask yourself: "In all honesty, what role might I have played or what stance might I have taken had I been there?" Doing so helps us develop appropriate humility, as we move toward Easter.

Such humility prepares us to experience the Resurrection as an act of God's grace and steadfast love toward all persons in all of time and space, including us.

### EASTER HYMN HIGHLIGHT

He is not here: For He is risen, as He said. Come see the place where the Lord lay. Mt. 28:6

Charles Wesley wrote the originally titled "Hymn for Easter Day" for the first service in the new chapel (Foundry Meeting House) in London in 1739, one year after his dramatic conversion experience. He was inspired by Paul's gospel truth in 1 Corinthians 15. It summarizes both the experience and meaning of Christ's resurrection. The popularity of the hymn is due in part to the tune for which the composer has never been identified. "Hallelujah" or "alleluia" is from the ancient Hebrew worship service and was a common expression of praise in the early Christian church. Jerome, an important leader in the early church and translator of the Bible into Latin, wrote that in his day the very ceilings of houses of worship were often shaken with the reverberating "Hallelujahs" when believers sang their praises to God.


> Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia! Earth and heaven in chorus say, Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth reply, Alleluia!

Love's redeeming work is done, Alleluia! Fought the fight, the battle won, Alleluia! Death in vain forbids Him rise, Alleluia! Christ has opened paradise, Alleluia!

Lives again our glorious King, Alleluia! Where, O death, is now thy sting? Alleluia! Dying once He all doth save, Alleluia! Where thy victory, O grave? Alleluia!


## CHILDREN'S DAY OUT UPDATE
