

#### **PSC Monthly Reports**

June: The Pastor Search Committee presents a monthly report to the church. In June we had two meetings with consultant Bill Owen via Zoom. We worked on the interview process for prospective pastoral candidates: what we should tell them about the church and what questions we should ask them. Of course, if we want to continue to consider a particular candidate, there are multiple interviews, each with a slightly different focus, so we have to have multiple lists of questions. The committee created a good first draft of each list and will work to finalize them at our next meeting. If you know someone who you think would be a good pastor, you should ask them to submit a resume. We will start accepting resumes on Monday July 17 and will continue for 30 days. Resumes have to be submitted by email and the church will create a new email address just for resumes.. This email address will be posted on the church web site on July 17.

July: July was a busy month for the Pastor Search Committee. We conducted interviews of the church staff. We worked in small groups to finalize the questions that would be asked of pastoral candidates in the four interviews. The email address for submitting resumes was posted on the church web site. No resumes have been received so far, but there have been a couple of requests for more information. We met yesterday by Zoom with our consultant Bill Owen. The work of the small groups was presented to the entire committee for discussion and finalization. We drew up a list of friends of the church who might know possible candidates. We are already in touch with CBF leadership in Tennessee. We made plans to contact CBF leaders in adjacent states. Our next meeting with Bill will be in two weeks. Please continue to pray for our committee.
