

Dear Friends,

Allow me to share a snapshot of what's coming our way early in 2023.

Starting the first Sunday in January, I plan to preach a sermon series titled: "You Don't Have To Be A Star." We'll



Early in 2023 we'll launch a church-wide prayer emphasis focused on preparing for a search for a pastor, preparing ourselves for new pastoral leadership, and opening ourselves to whatever future God has in mind for the congregation. We hope to offer opportunities for prayer in the prayer room, Sunday Bible study classes, small groups, at home, congregationally, and individually. Watch for further information.

Starting January 22, I will provide a series of presentations on LGBTQ and the Church. We'll look at relevant scriptures and the interpretative issues associated with each, history, science, experience, the role of the Holy Spirit, biblical analogies, and stories of how various congregations have dealt with the challenge. Finally, I hope we'll soon start the task of pulling together a Pastor Search Committee. My personal hunch is that the committee, once approved by the congregation, will navigate a search unique in the history of First Baptist Church. Its members will need our prayers and support along the way.

HYMN HIGHLIGHT

Christmastide is the twelve days after Christmas on the Christian Calendar. The season of Epiphany (meaning "appearance" or "manifestation") begins on January 6 observing the occasions when Jesus was revealed to be the Son of God—the visit of the Magi, his baptism, the miracles (especially at the wedding at Cana), and his victory over temptation in the desert. The emphasis on Christ's transfiguration comes at the end of this season.

A time-honored classic Epiphany hymn is "We Three Kings of Orient Are", #151, Celebrating Grace Hymnal, written by John H. Hopkins, Jr. in 1857. The kings named were most likely the Magi mentioned in Matthew 2:1: "After Jesus was born in Bethlehem . . . Magi from the east came . . ." The Magi were astrologers from lands east of Palestine, whose vocation was to study the stars in the attempt to discern the favorable conditions under which important decisions should be made. These kings were obviously well-versed in and favorably disposed toward Old Testament scriptures. The hymn begins with a narration of their journey, relentlessly following the star to find another king who, according to prophecy, would be born in Bethlehem. Verses describe the symbolic gifts they brought and their intent, concluding with a doxology of alleluias*. Space in this column won't permit all the stanzas; I hope you will open a hymnal and reflect on the light the Magi pursued and the light we seek and celebrate in the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

We three kings of Orient are; bearing gifts we traverse afar, field and fountain, moor and mountain, following yonder star.

Refrain:

O star of wonder, star of light, star with royal beauty bright, westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light.

Perhaps this past year, your seasons held more weeping than laughter, more mourning than dancing, searching without finding. Perhaps all the while, new life stubbornly broke forth; long awaited healing took place; and you embraced yourself and those around you. It is not only possible, but quite probable, that our realities hold both of these seemingly opposing experiences at the same time: weeping and laughter, searching and letting go. Whatever our past, current, and future experiences, may we allow them to bind us to God and enable us to draw nearer to one another. As written in Ecclesiastes 3:11, God makes "everything beautiful in its time." When I look around at our community and each individual member, I am in awe of the ways in which beauty is made out of so many circumstances, through God's ever willingness to work with and through our human minds and hearts. Thank you for being present for this life and sharing it with this community. Rest in the knowledge that whatever seasons 2023 brings, you are never experiencing them alone; you are always held – by God and those of us around you – with love. Happy New Year.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE CLASS

The English language class for internationals established by the deacons had a very successful fall semester. The class concluded the term with a Christmas celebration in which Kristi Sanford read a child's version of the Nativity, Marilyn Barr led in some caroling, and Charlie Wilson read in Spanish the Bethlehem story. After refreshments gifts were distributed. The children each received Bible story books in English, and the adults each received a Spanish-English parallel edition of the Bible. Because our two Japanese students can already read our language, they were presented Bibles in English. Of the \$3,750 budget approved by the budget committee for the class, a total of \$1,775 was expended for teacher training, curriculum materials, Wednesday night suppers for teachers and students, childcare, and Christmas gifts. We remain grateful to the church family for your enthusiastic support of this ministry and to the Lord for His abundant blessings.

Beginning January 11, 2023, English Languages Classes will continue in 2023 on Wednesdays from 6:00-7:30 pm in Room 301, with free dinner offered at 5:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.


