FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR

By the time you receive this newsletter, we will be well into Lent. What might we do to maximize the impact of Lent on our lives?

Many Christians choose to give up something in

observance of the season: chocolate, fast food, an expensive pastime, and the like come to mind. Others decide to take up a spiritual discipline in hope of turning the discipline into a habit. Examples include daily prayer, bible reading, doing something good for others at least once a week, fasting, and practicing silence while listening for Holy Spirit's guidance. Some Christians opt to focus on developing the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Did you notice what all such options have in common? They require us to make a decision to start a given practice, followed by subsequent decisions to continue the practice. As it turns out, Lent gives us an opportunity to strengthen our ability to make and live into decisions.

We ought not be surprised. After all, decision-making is at the heart of the Christian life for Christ followers and congregations. When Jesus says, "Come, follow me," he invites us to take up a kind of life in which decision-making is part and parcel of walking faithfully with Christ.

CALLED BUSINESS MEETING 3/5/23

Church Family,


We have spent much time in recent months dealing with our hopes and dreams, our fears and failures, and our identity and vision as we transition into a healthier season of church life. Transition has allowed us to see the past more clearly in order to better understand our present and to dare to look into the future. In light of this process, which has included listening sessions, congregational meetings, surveys, and presentations on topics of common interest, the Church Advisory Council (CAC) senses the need for us to claim our identity as a people of faith.

On behalf of the CAC, the trustees have requested a called business meeting be held on Sunday March 5, 2023 immediately after worship to consider the resolution concerning church membership printed below. While discussion will be welcomed according to the rules of order, the CAC sincerely hopes that the resolution will be adopted as written. The CAC believes the adoption of this resolution will do at least three things: (1) Cast a vision for us as a community of faith to pursue, (2) affirm our longstanding commitment to the Kingdom of God and God's people, and (3) better inform future members, leaders, and ministers of our shared values and aspirations. The resolution will read as follows:

Be it resolved that First Baptist Church, Jefferson City, TN declares that its membership is open to all persons regardless of race, social status, gender, and sexual identity and reaffirms its previously adopted motto "Breaking down barriers to proclaim the love of Christ".

Please plan to attend and consider this resolution as we continually discern God's voice in the life of this community of faith.
